







TRINIDAD & TOBAGO

- Kicked off the PROMAR Project with an Inception Meeting on April 23rd.
- Brought together stakeholders for a National Policy Dialogue on Marine Litter Prevention and led hands-on Capacity Building Workshops on Circular Economy and Extended Producer Responsibility (EPR) from June 3–4, 2025.
- Trained enumerators to carry out the Knowledge, Attitudes, and Practices (KAP) Survey on Marine Litter and General Waste, incorporating a Material Flow Analysis (MFA) component.
- Carried out three baseline shoreline samplings at Foreshore, Port of Spain, in June.







SURINAME

- Completed sampling activities and has collected and characterized a total of 693.69 kilograms of waste at 2 sampling sites.
- Brought together **56 stakeholders** for the Year 1 Project Update Meeting held on June 12th.
- Published Suriname's National Policy Brief on Marine Litter and Plastic Waste on the PROMAR website ahead of the Q4 policy dialogue.
- Delivered educational sessions at four secondary schools, boosting awareness of plastic pollution among 239 students.
- Delivered a Social Media Content and Promotion training to 17 participants from 10 organisations on 17–18 June.







GUYANA

- Hosted the National Policy Dialogue on Marine Litter Prevention and led Capacity Building Workshops on Circular Economy and Extended Producer Responsibility (EPR) from May 21–22.
- Led talks on launching a **Circular Economy Lab** at the University of Guyana (May 23).
- Showcased the PROMAR Project at the **Coastal Zone Canada 2025 Conference**.
- Mobilized volunteers for a second beach cleanup at Kingston Seawall on June 28, successfully removing 67.54 kg of litter.
- Installed Riverbooms that trapped **31,260 kg** of litter in June.
- Carried out a Household Material Flow Analysis (MFA) survey and secured 417 completed responses.













- Published St. Kitts and Nevis' National Policy Brief on Marine Litter and Plastic Waste Management on the PROMAR website.
- Held a National Policy Dialogue and Capacity Building Workshops on Circular Economy and Extended Producer Responsibility (EPR), June 11–12.
- Collected more than 450 responses for the Knowledge Attitude Practices (KAP) survey which includes a Material Flow Analysis (MFA) component.
- Started waste collection and characterization at the demonstration sites.



BRITISH VIRGIN ISLANDS

- Kicked off their first beach clean-up at Taddy Bay International Airport, Virgin Gorda in April 2025.
- Held a National Policy Dialogue and capacity-building workshops on marine litter, circular economy, and EPR on May 29–30.
- Partnered with Beyond the Reef for Wreck Week 2025, leading multiple clean-ups and removing **1,118.25 lbs** of waste.
- Engaged **local schools to boost awareness** on marine litter.
- Completed a Knowledge Attitude Practice (KAP) Survey with 383 responses collected.
- Developed a Material Flow Analysis (MFA) survey for schools and businesses which will be implemented soon.
